- ✓ Scientific and technical reference organisation for the vine and wine sector

INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNISED³



“for matters not covered by the Codex Alimentarius⁴, OIE⁵, IPPC⁶, appropriate standards, guidelines and **recommendations promulgated by other relevant international organisations** open for membership to all Members”

ADOPTED BY CONSENSUS⁷



7 steps process of adoption

Consensus shall be the normal method whereby the General Assembly shall adopt draft resolutions of a general, scientific, technical, economic or legal nature

PROJECTS OF RESOLUTION

- **VITI-SCRAISIN 20-678B “OIV definition of reconstituted grape juice”**
Aimed at defining the minimum Brix level for reconstituted grape juice elaborated with *V. labrusca* and hybrids thereof
- **VITI-SCRAISIN 23-742 “Minimum ripening standards for the marketing of table grapes for fresh consumption”**
Aimed at updating the standard on minimum maturity requirements (Resolution OIV VITI 1/2008)
- **VITI-SCRAISIN 22-714 “OIV guidelines for the production of organic table grape”**
Aimed at defining the practices to produce table grape organically

SURVEYS & EXPERTISE COLLECTIVE DOCUMENTS

- Survey on the cost production calculation for table grapes production
- Revision, updating and codification of resolutions on dried grapes
- Pre and postharvest management to decrease rachis dehydration
- Drying method in the grapevine ad alternative to produce dried grapes
- Glossary of the vitivinicultural terms
- Collection of technical sheets for the table and dried grapes production systems
- Table grape production grown under multiple-crops-a-year-system in subtropical and tropical conditions
- Contribution of radiation UVC to reduce or eliminate the powdery mildew and other fungus in table grapes, dried, juice grapes

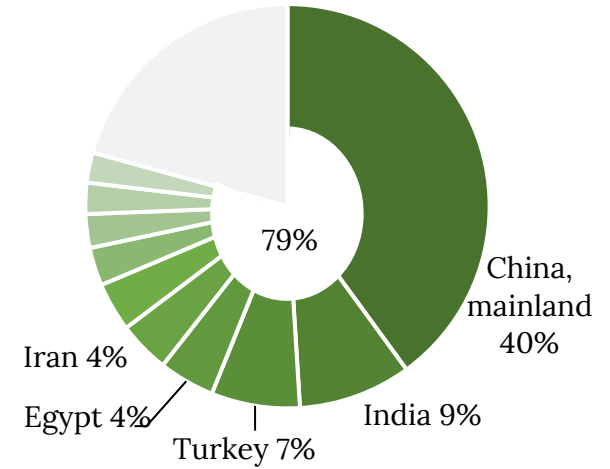
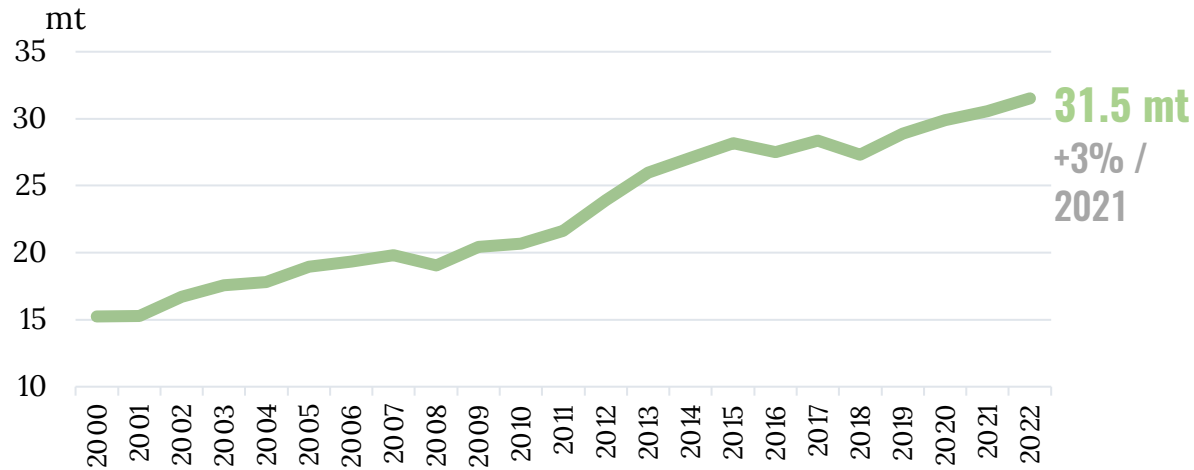




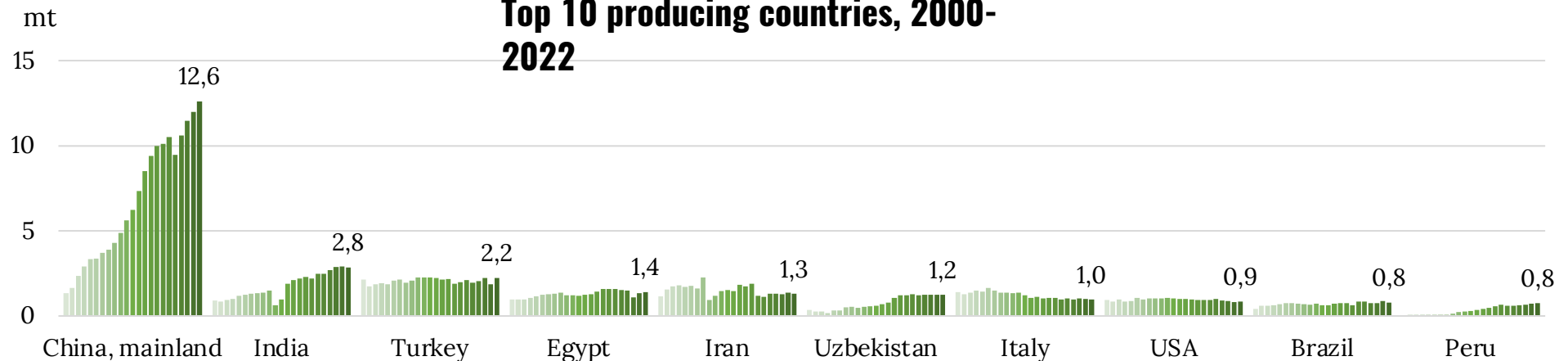
Table Grape

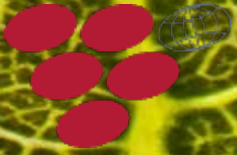
Table grape refers to fresh grape destined for direct human consumption

What future challenges for Viticulture Commission?

1st There is a need to carry out joint work to face the **climate change**:

✓ *selection of new varieties of the vineyard (resistant to biotic and abiotic stress) and the challenges involved in the organoleptic quality of the wines*

2nd Taking into account the issues of **vitivinicultural sustainability**:

✓ *sustainable use of water, energy, inputs that can ensure the sustainability of the sector*

✓ *low environmental impact and respond to new social expectations*

3th Conservation of **(bio) diversity**:

✓ *genetic diversity and biodiversity in the vineyard*

4th Contribute to the development of the **table grape sector**:

✓ *a very important sector in several countries but also important in terms of consumption*
